**ESEA Spring Planning Meeting**  
**June 1, 2017**  
**Agenda / Meeting Summary**

**1. ESEA District Needs Assessment Review**

The committee discussed WISEdash assessments (district performance), Aimsweb Benchmarking, and Progress Monitoring. We also discussed Needs Assessment meeting held to review Schoolwide and Targeted Title I projects. Discussion of changes coming into effect during the 2017-2018 school year for ESEA/ESSA “Every Student Succeeds Act”. Discussion regarding Federal and State changes to the law.

**2. Identify Districts Needs**

Discussed programs that the district has in place to monitor student progress. Aimsweb / Progress Monitoring / monthly RtI grade level meetings / RtI Leadership Team / Schoolwide and Targeted Assistance committee meetings. Discussion of progress with implementation of (PBIS / RtI / Effective Educator and Common Core Standards initiatives.

**3. Private School Participation**

Explained to the committee members that both of our private schools (Pleasant View and Twin Lakes Amish Schools) were sent invitations to this meeting and that I annually drive to the homes of both schools representatives and briefly explain ESEA and IDEA programs and then they sign off on the documents to not participate.

**4. Parent and Community Involvement**

Demonstrated District Policy for ESEA and Title I. Discussed website resources for the District’s Report Card, Parents Rights, and Policies. Discussion took place about information that is published *Trojan Talk*.

**5. Integration with Other Programs and Initiatives**

The committee discussed and reviewed how the ESEA goals and objectives are aligned and integrated into other federal and state programs or initiatives (ie. REAP, AGR “Achievement Gap Reduction”, and IDEA).

**6. Homeless Student Services/Foster Care POC**

Explained to the committee members the role and responsibilities of the Homeless Liaison for the district. Briefly reviewed the district’s responsibilities to provide immediate enrollment, food programs, and transportation to homeless students. Liaison attended informational meetings hosted by CESA 10. Also, that the Liaison has brochures and general information packets from National Center for Homeless Education. Briefly discussed the new impact of the district’s Foster Care POC role regarding law changes.

**7. Professional Development and Data Analysis**

Reviewed the district’s professional development, goals, and planning document. Staff Development for technology, RtI, math, PBIS, Common Core Standards, Effective Educators, Balanced Literacy, Everyday Math and Lucy Calkins-Writer’s Workshop has been the district’s focus now and into the next school year. Many of these professional development activities are provide by or through CESA 10.
