Addendum: Revenue Limit Exemption for Energy Conservation s.121.91(4)(0)1. The School District of New Auburn exercised its taxing authority to exceed the revenue limit on a non-recurring basis by \$77,558 on energy efficiency measures and renewable energy products for the 2014-2015 school year. The district has expended \$77,558 of this revenue limit authority. The installation of the energy efficiency equipment was completed in December of 2014. The first energy measurement and verification audit will take place in January of 2016 covering the period January through December of 2015. No verified savings have yet been measured as of today. In the future, the district plans to meet or exceed the following performance indicators: Boiler Replacement Project: \$2,005 annual savings; Controls Upgrade and Building Envelope Project: \$3,912 annual savings; The Heating and Cooling Project will actually increase costs \$3,448 annually. This will yield an over all net savings of at least \$2,469 per

vear.

The 11.96242 mill rate was calculated using an estimated property valuation of \$271,626,037, an estimated 295 student count and an estimated \$351,735 of state aid. The actual mill rate will be determined using the actual October 2015 property valuation, the actual September 18, 2015 student count and the actual state aid which will not be available until October 2015.

School Information

Schedule-All students in grades 7-12 will receive their schedules for the 2015-2016 school year on September 2nd, the first day of school, during home room. Elementary students please see the recommended school supply list for preparations prior to Tuesday, September 1st.

Annual School Board Meeting-The School District of New Auburn's annual meeting is scheduled for Monday, August 24th at 7:30 PM in the High School Library. The regular board meeting will be held before the annual meeting at 5:30 PM. August 24th

New Residents-People that are new to the community are encouraged to register their students as early as they can and arrange for an orientation to the building.

New Auburn Season Athletic Passes-School District of New Auburn season athletic passes will be available for purchase from the district office. This pass is valid for all home athletic events. Fans who frequent athletic events will be able to save money by not paying the gate admission for each event. The owner of the ticket may use the pass an unlimited amount of times. The pass is good for the entire 2015-2016 school year and is valid for all home athletic competitions, ex-cluding WIAA playoff events. These passes may be purchased at the district office during school hours.

Closed Campus-Lunch period is closed for elementary, Junior High and High School Students (PK-11th). Seniors (12th) have open campus during lunch only if the *Open Campus Parent form* has been completed and turned in at the High School Office.

Student Dress Code-All K-12 students are reminded that we have a very specific dress code in New Auburn. The following is the dress code as it is stated in the **Student Handbook**:

Students are reminded that we have a dress code in New Auburn that encourages students to take pride in their appearance. For that reason, we tell you that students may not wear clothing that is too revealing, advertises tobacco products, alcohol, drugs or sexually explicit or inappropriate messages. Students wearing inappropriate clothing will be asked to change into something appropriate. Student and parent cooperation in this area is appreciated.

As students and parents purchase school clothes, please keep the following in mind:

Absolutely no bare midriffs when walking in the halls or sitting in class.	Clothing must cover underwear.
A minimum of 4" strap on tops.	No head covercaps, hats, headbands, bandanas, etc.
The old fashion "undershirt" may not be worn unless it is covered by an appropriate shirt.	Shorts, skirts and dresses must be as long as the fingertips extended down the side of the legs.

Remember...clothing may not be too revealing. I ask that parents use these guidelines when helping your child purchase clothes for school. Education is the priority in the New Auburn School and inappropriate clothing is a distraction to learning. I appreciate everyone's assistance in making the New Auburn school a place we can be proud of. If you have any questions or comments about the Dress Code, please feel free to contact the school.

Cell Phones-There is little doubt that the use of cell phones and other electronic communication devices have changed the way we live and work in the 21st century. I am asking that parents advise their students to leave all cell phones at home. If parents and students decide it is necessary for their child to carry a communication device, they must abide by district policy in the Student Handbook.

Football– August 4th, 8 am—11:00 am, was the first football practice for grades 9-12. Players are reminded to have physicals and athletic codes turned into the High School office before practice begins.

Volleyball-August 17th, 4:30 pm-8:00 pm. was the first volleyball practice. Players are reminded to have physicals and athletic codes turned into the High School office before practice begins.

Cross Country-Aug. 17th, 9 am—11 am, was the first practice for Cross Country. Players are reminded to have physicals and athletic codes turned into the High School office before practice begins.

Jr. High Football – Aug 6th, 10:00 am—12:00 pm, was the first practice for Jr. High Football. Players are reminded to have physicals and athletic codes turned into the High School office before practice begins.

Jr. High Volleyball—Aug 17th, 6:00 pm—8:00 pm. Was the first football practice for Jr Hi Volleyball. Players are reminded to have physicals and athletic codes turned into the High School office before practice begins.

Welcome Back Open House-An open house will be held for all parents and community members on August 27th at 11:00 a.m. and concluding at 7:00 p.m.

Request for Changes to Bus Stop/Drop Off-Liabilities placed on the school district require all request for exceptions be made in writing.

Loading/Unloading of Buses at School-Your cooperation is sought when students are loading and unloading. Please respect the flashing stop sign on the bus by not passing the bus until the stop sign has been turned off and has been pulled back to the bus. After school and before school, please do not drive past the buses or pick up your child in the bus area when they are loading and unloading. When dropping off or picking up children before or after school, please use the East Street driveway.

Bus Behavior-We would appreciate it if you would discuss the following bus behavior infractions with your child, regardless of age. New Auburn Student Parking

Student parking will be in the EAST parking lot. The south spaces are numbered and assigned on a class drawing basis only after a parking form is complete and turned in. Forms are available in the High School office. The earliest acceptance date for this form will be the first day of school. Please turn forms back into the High School Office.

NO unauthorized vehicles will be allowed in this lot.

Violations

1st—Written warning (car to be moved) **2nd**—Lose parking lot privileges for 10 school days.

Directory Data-Each fall parents will be given the choice as to the release of directory data concerning their students. Directory data is defined as the student name and grade. Parents will have fourteen days, September 1st through September 14th, to inform the school in writing that they do not want their students listed in the directory data bank.

Student Nondiscrimination-It is the policy of the School District of New Auburn that no person may be denied the benefits of, or be discriminated against in any curricular, extra-curricular, pupil service, recreational, or other program or activity because of the person's sex, race, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, or physical mental emotional, or learning disability of handicap as required by s.118.13, Wis. Stats. This policy also prohibits discrimination as defined by Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972 (sex). Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (race and national origin), and section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973.

The district encourages informal resolution of complaints under this policy. A formal complaint resolution procedure is available, however, to ad-dress allegations of violations of the policy in the School District of New Auburn. Any questions concerning this policy should be directed to:

Student Records-

- 1. General-Students records are maintained in the interest of the student and to assist the school in providing appropriate experiences.
- 2. Content will relate to the individual student's academic progress and behavior.
- 3. Confidentiality will be maintained at all times. Only the following exceptions will be allowed;
 - A. Parents or guardians of minors be shown or provided a copy of the records upon request.
 - B. Upon subpoena the school will provide a court judge with a copy of all records.
 - C. Upon written permission of the parents or legal guardian the school shall provide a copy to the person named in the permission statement.
 - D. Qualified educational personnel who have care of the student.
- 4. Maintenance and destruction of records upon graduation, students will be allowed to review their records and keep all but academic progress reports. All behavior records remaining will be destroyed within one year. Academic progress records will be destroyed after 35 years.
- 5. Transfer of records to another institution will take place upon receipt of a written request following the signing out of the student.
- 6. Content may be challenged by the student, parent or legal guardian by contacting the school counselor.

Weapons-No one shall possess a dangerous weapon on school property, school busses, or at any school-related event. A dangerous weapon is defined as any object that by design and /or use can cause bodily injury or property damage.

Drug Free School-At no time are students to be at school, school functions, on school grounds, or school related activities using tobacco, or posses-sion or use of alcohol or drugs.

Student attendance and program or curriculum modifications-Pursuant to statute 118.15 (1 (d) parents or legal guardians may request the school board to provide the student with program or curriculum modifications. To exercise this right please contact Mr. Martens at 715/237-2505



PUBLIC RELEASE NATIONAL SCHOOL LUNCH AND BREAKFAST PROGRAMS, SPECIAL MILK PROGRAM

The School District of New Auburn today announced its policy for children unable to pay the full price of meals served under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program. Each school office and the central office has a copy of the policy, which may be reviewed by any interested party.

The following household size and income criteria will be used for determining eligibility. Children from families whose annual income is at or below the levels shown are eligible for free and reduced price meals or free milk if a split-session student does not have access to the school lunch or breakfast service.

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk, households must fill out the application and return it to the school (unless notified at the start of the school year that children are eligible through direct certification). Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by agency or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children in a household where one or more household members receive FoodShare, FDPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, list the household member and the FoodShare, FDPIR or W-2 case number, list the names of all school children, sign the application, and return it to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals application: names of all household members and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or mark the box to the right of "Check if no SSN". Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal the lunch determining official will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to Scott Johnson, Superintendent of New Auburn School, PO Box 110, New Auburn, WI 54757. 715-237-2202

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the household eligible for reduced price meals or free meals or free milk if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above, and they may reapply at that time.

Children formally placed in foster care are also eligible for free meal benefits. Foster children may be certified as eligible without a household application. Households with foster children and non-foster children may choose to include the foster child as a household member, as well as any personal income available to the foster child, on the same application that includes their non-foster children.

The information provided by the household on the application is confidential. Public Law 103-448 limits the release of student free and reduced price school meal eligibility status to persons directly connected with the administration and enforcement of federal or state educational programs. Consent of the parent/guardian is needed for other purposes such as waiver of text book fees.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS ABOUT FREE AND REDUCED PRICE SCHOOL MEALS

Dear Parent/Guardian:

Children need healthy meals to learn. New Auburn School] offers healthy meals every school day. Breakfast costs Jr. High/High School \$1.95 Pre-k thru 6 \$.00; lunch costs Pre-k thru 6 \$2.05, Jr.High/High School \$2.25. Your children may qualify for free meals or for reduced price meals. Reduced price is \$.30 for breakfast and [\$.40 for lunch. This packet includes an application for free or reduced price meal benefits, and a set of detailed instructions. Below are some common questions and answers to help you with the application process.

1. WHO CAN GET FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEALS?

- All children in households receiving benefits from FoodShare, the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or W-2 Cash Benefits are eligible for free meals.
- Foster children that are under the legal responsibility of a foster care agency or court are eligible for free meals.
- Children participating in their school's Head Start program are eligible for free meals.
- · Children who meet the definition of homeless, runaway, or migrant are eligible for free meals.
- Children may receive free or reduced price meals if your household's income is within the limits on the Federal Income Eligibility Guidelines. Your children may qualify for free or reduced price meals if your household income falls at or below the limits on this chart.

- 2. HOW DO I KNOW IF MY CHILDREN QUALIFY AS HOMELESS, MIGRANT, OR RUNAWAY? Do the members of your household lack a permanent address? Are you staying together in a shelter, hotel, or other temporary housing arrangement? Does your family relocate on a seasonal basis? Are any children living with you who have chosen to leave their prior family or household? - DO I NEED TO FILL OUT AN APPLICATION FOR EACH CHILD? No. Use one Free and Reduced Price School Meals
 Application for all students in your household. We cannot approve an application that is not complete, so be sure to fill

- 4. SHOULD I FILL OUT AN APPLICATION IF I RECEIVED A LETTER THIS SCHOOL YEAR SAYING MY CHILDREN ARE ALREADY APPROVED FOR FREE MEALS? No, but please read the letter you got carefully and follow the instructions. If any children in your household were missing from your eligibility notification, contact Lucy Lenfesty, New Auburn School, PO Box 110, New Auburn, WI 54757, 715-237-2202 ext 106 immediately.
- 5. CAN I APPLY ONLINE? Yes! You are encouraged to complete an online application instead of a paper application if you are able. The online application has the same requirements and will ask you for the same information as the paper application. Visit www.newauburn.k12.wi.us to begin or to learn more about the online application process. Contact

- 6. MY CHILD'S APPLICATION WAS APPROVED LAST YEAR. DO I NEED TO FILL OUT A NEW ONE? Yes. Your child's application is only good for that school year and for the first few days of this school year. You must send in a new application unless the school told you that your child is eligible for the new school year.
- 7. I GET WIC. CAN MY CHILDREN GET FREE MEALS? Children in households participating in WIC <u>may</u> be eligible for free or reduced price meals. Please send in an application.
- WILL THE INFORMATION I GIVE BE CHECKED? Yes. We may also ask you to send written proof of the household income you report.
- IF I DON'T QUALIFY NOW, MAY I APPLY LATER? Yes, you may apply at any time during the school year. For example, children with a parent or guardian who becomes unemployed may become eligible for free and reduced price meals if the household income drops below the income limit.
- WHAT IF I DISAGREE WITH THE SCHOOL'S DECISION ABOUT MY APPLICATION? You should talk to school officials.

- MAY I APPLY IF SOMEONE IN MY HOUSEHOLD IS NOT A U.S. CITIZEN? Yes. You, your children, or other household members do not have to be U.S. citizens to apply for free or reduced price meals.
- 12. WHAT IF MY INCOME IS NOT ALWAYS THE SAME? List the amount that you normally receive. For example, if you normally make \$1000 each month, but you missed some work last month and only made \$900, put down that you made \$1000 per month. If you normally get overtime, include it, but do not include it if you only work overtime sometimes. If you have lost a job or had your hours or wages reduced, use your current income.
- 13. WHAT IF SOME HOUSEHOLD MEMBERS HAVE NO INCOME TO REPORT? Household members may not receive some types of income we ask you to report on the application, or may not receive income at all. Whenever this happens, please write a 0 in the field. However, if any income fields are left empty or blank, those will also be counted as zeroes. Please be careful when leaving income fields blank, as we will assume you meant to do so.
- 14. WE ARE IN THE MILITARY. DO WE REPORT OUR INCOME DIFFERENTLY? Your basic pay and cash bonuses must be reported as income. If you get any cash value allowances for off-base housing, food, or clothing, or receive Family Subsistence Supplemental Allowance payments, it must also be included as income. However, if your housing is part of the Military Housing Privatization Initiative, do not include your housing allowance as income. Any additional combat pay resulting from deployment is also excluded from income.
- 15. WHAT IF THERE ISN'T ENOUGH SPACE ON THE APPLICATION FOR MY FAMILY? List any additional household members on a separate piece of paper, and attach it to your application. - MY FAMILY NEEDS MORE HELP. ARE THERE OTHER PROGRAMS WE MIGHT APPLY FOR? To find out how to apply for FoodShare or other assistance benefits, contact your local assistance office or call 1-800-362-3002.
