OPEN ENROLLMENT FOR 2017-2018

Application period is February 6th April 28th, 2017

Parents who wish to choose the public school district their children will attend next year have an important set of dates approaching: The February 6th — April 28th open enrollment application window. Under the Public School Open Enrollment Program, parents must apply during the application period to the school district they wish to have their children attend.

The DPI provides the following guidelines for parents who wish to apply for open enrollment:

- ◆ Open enrollment deadlines are firm. The DPI requests that Open Enrollment forms be submitted on-line. You will find the website listed below. If you do not have access to a computer, please come to the school and we will help you fill out the form on-line.
- ◆ Parents may submit applications to no more than three non-resident school districts. Early and late applications will not be accepted.
- ◆ If your child attended a non-resident district under open enrollment for 2016-2017 you are NOT required to reapply for 2017-2018.

FREE OR REDUCED PRICE MEAL PROGRAM

For many years, the Department of Agriculture has conducted the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program. Under this program, eligible students receive school lunch and breakfast at no cost or reduced priced. Eligibility is based upon a formula that considers family income and the number of people in the household.

Parents are strongly encouraged to apply for free or reduced price meals benefits. The completed

application should be submitted to the administrative office (Bonnie). Parents are quickly notified if their children qualify for this program.

Any time your income changes, you may reapply to see if you qualify for free or reduced lunch.

click on the Families drop-down then under Forms is the application form. Fill it out and return it to Bonnie.

New Auburn Friend of Education Award

The purpose of the New Auburn Friend of Education Award is to publicly recognize significant service to the students of the School District of New Auburn by individuals, businesses or organizations.

ELIGIBILITY

- I. An individual, business, or organization that has made a significant contribution of time, talents, or funds which greatly affects student learning, opportunities, achievement or athletics, or to the district in general.
- II. Those nominated shall be positive role models in conduct and character.
- III. Current employees of the School District of New Auburn are ineligible.
- IV. Former employees of the School District of New Auburn may be considered based on service to the school district outside of their course of employment with the District.

NOMINATION

- I. Anonymous nominations shall not be accepted.
- II. Only completed nominations received by the deadline shall be considered.
- III. Completed nomination forms should be returned to the

no later than **March 17, 2017**.

- IV. Nominations may be made posthumously.
- V. Receipt and disposition of each nomination shall be reported to the nominator by the committee.

SELECTION

- I. The committee shall review and discuss all nominations received.
- II. The committee shall vote on each nominee by secret ballot. Names of nominees and results of ballots shall be considered confidential. Name(s) of recipient(s) shall be considered confidential until officially announced. (Recusal for votes on family members—define family).
- III. The committee shall determine the number of awards that may be given in any one year. (For example, the committee may decide to honor one individual, one business, and one organization in the same year).
- IV. The committee may decide that no award to be given in a particular year.
- V. All nominations shall be kept on file for a period of five years. In the event a nominee does not receive an award the first year he/she is nominated, the nomination shall automatically be reconsidered for the next four years. It is possible that one individual could have several different nominations in the file at any given time.
- VI. The committee shall notify the recipients of the award.
- VII. The committee shall notify the **nominators** of each nominee.
- VIII. The committee shall make a public announcement of the award.

RECOGNITION

- I. The award recipient(s) shall receive a framed certificate.
- II. The award recipient(s) will be honored with a plaque on display in the New Auburn School Building.




On Friday, March 24th the School District of New Auburn will hold a Kindergarten Open House for children who will be 5 years old by September 1, 2017.

FFA Mini-Career Fair Spotlights. . .

New Auburn students enrolled in the 8th Grade Careers Class held a *Mini-Career Fair* which was presented to students in the fourth grade class. Eighth Grade Careers Class were required to research a career which included gathering information about career advantages, career disadvantages, job risks, educational requirements, steps to success, and the inspiring work behind the career generating a “greater good to the world.” Students compiled the information and then created a three-fold display which also included photographs reflective of the work related to the career.

Derrick Taylor researched the career of being a *Landscaper*. Derrick’s display included example plans of landscapes in a birds-eye view format. His entire display was eye-catching as it was completed with a mosaic emphasis. What he gathered from his research related to landscaping is “Life is full of beauty... Notice It.”

Peyton Trowbridge completed his career research on a *Wind Turbine Technician*. During his study on this career he found that *Lakeshore Technical College* in Cleveland, WI offers an Associate Degree in Wind Energy. Students were able to view miniature sample wind turbines at his career display site.

Mikayla Boehm selected *Food Scientist* as a career to research. Mikayla found that it was a very unique career with the need for jobs increasing. A higher level of education is required for this career with a selection of emphasis including health, food, safety, and technology.

Matthew Nimsger decided to create a three-fold display on the career as a *Baker*. Matthew noted that there are culinary schools providing education beyond high school with a required apprenticeship. There is also a Pastry Arts Associate’s Degree for those interested in this industry as a career pathway.

Jeremy Java designed a display emphasizing *Animator* as a career. Jeremy’s work included sample animations. He also included a researched quote which stated, “*In animation, I was given a chance.*” Jeremy found one of the real advantages in this career field is being able to share creative talent.



Noah Smith chose *IT (Information Technology) Manager*. Noah’s research connected to this career indicated the importance of training beyond the high school diploma. During his presentation, Noah displayed parts located inside the computer as an example of what an IT Manager works with.

Zachary Fedie decided on the career of *Diesel Mechanic* as his choice of research. Zachary’s research included the importance of mechanical training beyond high school and the need for trained diesel mechanics. Zachary’s presentation included sample tools that a Diesel Mechanic would use.

Tristen Harder outlined key information related to becoming a *Pharmacist*. His research associated with this career included the strong importance of complete training for a Doctor of Pharmacy Degree.

Brady Bischel shared information on his three-fold display about becoming a *Neurosurgeon*. He explained the necessary education requirements and discussed the requirement of passing medical exams to become state licensed and board certified. He selected the following motivational quote for his career display, “*Study Hard. Do good and the good life will follow.*”

Gretchen Arton selected *Pediatrician* for her career choice to research. Gretchen’s display included the advantage of being able to help children when they are ill working as a pediatrician. In her research she identified the educational steps beyond a high school diploma including a *Pediatric Residency Program* and completing a medical exam to obtain a license.

Nick Walker’s career research centered on *Marketing Manager*. Nick identified key job skills including project management, budgeting, computer, hiring, training, managing, report writing and interpersonal skills. At his presentation station, fourth grade students were able to analyze advertisements as a hands-on activity.

Savannah Clark selected a *Registered Nurse* as a career to research. Savannah recognized the important steps to success for this career pathway. One of the advantages she listed was helping people and saving lives.

McKenzie Frank researched the career of *Physician’s Assistant*. Her display board included photographs relating the environment that a *Physician’s Assistant* would work in and some of the tools used. She recognized one of the steps to success was obtaining healthcare experience.

There are a wide array of career pathways to discover and researching specific careers increases student’s knowledge of these various pathways.
